Societies Registration Act, under the Chairmanship of Dr. VK Raju MD, FRCS, FACS, a US based world renowned Ophthalmologist, Regional Eye Associates; President and Founder, Eye Foundation of America; President and Founder, Goutami Eye Institute; Clinical Professor, West Virginia University, Director, International Ocular Surface Society; Adjunct Professor, GSL Medical School, Adjunct Professor, Wilmer Eye Institute, Johns Hopkins University. Pediatric Retina Symposium

Goutami Eye Institute & Eye Foundation of America, conducted a Symposium on Sunday January 5, 2020 on "Pediatric Retina" under the aegis of Indian Medical Association Rajahmundry.

The symposium was inaugurated by Dr. V.K. Raju, MD, FRCS, FACS, President, Eye Foundation of America and Chairman Goutami Eye Institute, Rajahmundry.

Dr. Raju highlighted the need for awareness of possible blindness in newborn and the required screening and treatment to avoid the same. He also briefed about the children who were blind and were treated with corneal transplant while restoring the vision.

Eminent Doctors viz., Dr. Mahesh P. Shanmugam, Dr. Anand Vinekar, Dr. Madhu Kumar, Dr. Rajesh Ramanjulu and Dr. Y. Srinivas Reddy illustrated the developments coming up and the advancement of technology in treatment of Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) in pursuance of "A World without Childhood Blindness". The specialists spoke on Screening & Management, Role of Telemedicine in treating ROP, Retinal disorders, Patient-Parent relationship in pediatric ophthalmology. Pediatric Retinal Detachment etc.,

About 100 doctors from various hospitals attended the symposium which was well received.













Prevention of Childhood Blindness of Premature Babies: Rotary Club of Calcutta: Centennial Project

(Eye Foundation of America / Goutami Eye Institute, Rajahmundry in Association with Rotary Club of Calcutta and Priyamvada Birla Aravind Eye Hospital, Kolkata)

Having heard the success story and the track record of GEMROP in successfully treating ROP, Rtn. PP Saumen Ray of Rotary Club of Calcutta and Centenary Chair, requested Dr. V.K. Raju, President of EFA and Chairman, GEI to extend GEMROP at the various Neo Neonatal clinics attached to Semi Government and Private Hospitals in Kolkata and adjoining Districts and States as necessary as part of their Centenary Celebrations of the Rotary Club of Calcutta and make it a flagship program.

Accordingly, EFA / GEI entered into an MOU with the Rotary Club, Calcutta and Priyamvada Birla Aravind Eye Hospital, Kolkata (PBAEH) and gifted a Retinal Camera for this purpose and the program was formerly launched by Dr. V.K. Raju on December 31, 2019 / January 01, 2020.

Even in the difficult times of Covid-19, both the screening as well as treatment of ROP infants is in progress by PBAEH. During the period March – June 2020, 242 babies were screened and 30 babies were treated.

Eye Screening Camp - Road Safety Week

We have organized an eye screening camp on 18th January 2020 on the occasion of Road Safety week (8-01-2020 to 24-01-2020) in association with Transport Department at the Rajahmundry Mini Goods and Vehicles Owner's Association, Hukumpeta, Rajahmudnry, East Godavari District, Andhra Pradesh.

We have screened 355 people and provided spectacles for 47 patients. We have performed surgeries for 13 patients and restored the eye sight.



Tribal Eye Screening Camp

As part of our outreach activity, we have organized an eye screening camp on 15th February 2020 at Gabbilala Konda, a Tribal village located in a forest area in Chintoor Mandal of East Godavari District, Andhra Pradesh in association with Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA), Chintoor.

Gabbilala Konda is far away and doesn't have regular transportation. The village is on the hill top, surrounded by green hills, thick forests, and small streams. The people living here are tribal and they have their own unique culture and traditions.

life here isn't easy There is no electricity, no health care facilities but they are living by adapting traditional approaches.

With a great difficulty our team reached to their village and organized screening camp. We have screened 120 people and provided spectacles for 70 patients. We have brought 10 patients who required cataract surgery in our transportation to base hospital and restore their eye sight.



COVID-19 Pandemic

From March 2020 onwards due to COVID-19 pandemic all the service activities halted due to Government of India restrictions. partial lockdowns, curfews and complete lockdown to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

COVID-19 Relief Activities

Goutami Eye Institute, as a responsible entity, believe and "do things for people not because of what they are or what they do in return, but because of who we are" and as a humble gesture towards community we have distributed food packets to the migrant labourers, who were travelling from/to far off places. The migrant labourers, including women, children and the elderly, who were travelling by foot / bicycles / other modes of transport from Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Telangana and other distant places to their native places as there was no other source of livelihood due to the crisis created by the coronavirus, were given food packets and water. A camp was also organized for the benefit of these affected labourers at Diwancheruvu wherein Electrol (ORS) packets, refreshments and cool drinks were provided to the children and elderly by the staff of Goutami Eye Institute.


